PROGRAM

Chris Parker, the Director of Planning for the City of Dover spoke to the club. He thanked the club for our contributions to the Park Street Park and the Dover Trail Head projects.

Chris has worked for the City for thirteen years and has been the Planning Director for four years. He explained that one of his goals has been to make the city's land use code user friendly and that his department has embraced new technologies and worked to communicate with the community on an on-going basis with weekly press releases on a variety of topics.

In adopting the Form Based Code, the goal was to have our zoning reflect the community character. This has redefined how zoning is done in the city.

Chris mentioned that his department will be sponsoring a Green Commute Week in May. This effort will try to get people to get to their job by any means but an automobile. That might mean walking, biking, or public transit.

He commented on the recent census results which indicated the Dover grew by 3100 residents in the last ten years. The city's population now stands at 29,887 and resulted in Dover becoming the fifth largest city in the state (had been 7th). This jump will probably result in an additional state rep seat for Dover. He indicated that the city is a desirable place to live which accounts for the gain in population.

When asked about the Tuttle property, he said that his department is working with the family and any interested parties to find the right end use for this very unique piece of land. He also told us that he expects ground to be broken next spring on the waterfront project. The Dickinson Group is contractually obligated to begin work in 2012, so the city should see activity begin at that time.
