Somewhere between the Your Host Restaurant and a stint at nursing school, she married her first husband and had three children. Their new career, managing independent living centers, took them from New York state, to Massachusetts and New Hampshire where they currently manage Maple Suites, an independent living facility in Dover. The facility houses up to 115 people and currently has 35 residents. The center provides, in one monthly fee, all meals, utilities (except phones) and a 21-passenger bus for shopping, medical visits and special events.
