#### PROGRAM



Jamie Devlin and Heidi Tripp from the American Red Cross were this meetings speakers.

Jamie has been executive director for the past 18 months. He told the club that the American Red Cross was chartered in 1905 by Congress (unfunded, to boot) with two main missions: disaster response and emergency messaging to service members. Both of the missions continue to this day.

Before military commanders will authorize an emergency leave, Red Cross personnel must verify the information and situation and then will relay their findings to the appropriate command structure. That effort is managed by 16 volunteers in the Seacoast area.

The second mission, that of emergency response, is coordinated by 100 seacoast volunteers. This effort involves working with search and rescue personnel and responding to emergency situations, such as fires. In that instance the goal is to provide shelter, clothes and food for the affected individuals in the first 3 to 5 days after the event.

Heidi spent a few moments talking about the blood collection program in the state, where the Red Cross is the only blood collection agency in NH. This program is monitored by the FDA and to meet the needs of the hospitals in the state, 250 pints of blood are needed per day.

The American Red Cross is a 501-c 3 organization and depends on private donations and some fee for service programs to fund its operations. Jamie indicated that there are three ways individuals can help—become a volunteer, donate blood or make a monetary donation to help further their mission.
