- Create a core program which expands awareness of community and a broad range of issues affecting the seacoast
- Presenting diverse points of view on topics being studied
- Stressing the interconnectedness of the topics covered during the program year.
- Develop an expanded awareness of effective community leadership practices
- Provide opportunities to explore personal involvement in action
- Provide continued opportunity for alumni to further develop their knowledge of issues and effective leadership practices
- Inspire and encouraging alumni in their ongoing engagement in their communities

Create a broad network of resources for program alumni Leadership Seacoast provides a core program of day-long presentations and discussions aimed at presenting and analyzing issues affecting the cultural, social, political, and economic lives of residents of the seacoast. Class participation and shared knowledge, expertise, and personal perspectives are important aspects of providing a well-rounded curriculum.

Their program challenges the personal assumptions of participants while exposing them to diverse ideas, resources, and community leadership practices as we explore regional and community issues.

Each program session is custom designed to explore issues and the trends in our region through a variety of discussions, workshops, presentations, field trips and other hands-on experiences. Every effort is made to create an experiential learning environment that will introduce participants to new places and new ideas. Program days take place on a regular rotation from January to June, usually beginning at 8am and ending at 4:30pm. A typical program year will include:
